major roles of winbindd

- ▶ authentication proxy (to domain)
- ▶ id mapping

standard setups (according to samba)

- ▶ member:
 - ▶ auth+idmap: smbd → libwbclient → winbindd
 - ▶ nsswitch → libnss_winbind → winbindd
 - ▶ auth: winbindd → AD/DC
 - ▶ idmap: winbindd → idmap(db/calculation)
- ▶ AD/DC:
 - ▶ auth: smbd(samba) → samba(db)
 - ▶ idmap: smbd(samba) → libwbclient → samba(winbind)
 - ▶ nsswitch → libnss_winbind → samba(winbind)
- ▶ AD/DC WIP (Andrew):
 - ▶ auth: smbd(samba) → samba(db)
 - ▶ idmap: smbd → libwbclient → winbindd(samba)
 - ▶ nsswitch → libnss_winbind → winbindd(samba)

strange setups (according to ... /me)

- ▶ member:
 - ▶ auth: smbd → AD/DC
 - ▶ idmap: smbd → nsswitch → ldap/nis/file/sssd
 - ▶ nss → sssd → AD/DC
- ▶ AD/DC:
 - ▶ auth: smbd(samba) → samba
 - ▶ idmap: smbd(samba) → libwbclient → winbind(samba)
 - ▶ nsswitch → sssd → samba (rfc2307)
 - ▶ inconsistent
